DC Sheriff's Dept/Emergency Mgt – Chief Moore was unable to attend and Ed Yeats reported for him that there is still a Bear problem and that the Sheriff's office has had a huge number of bear calls. These are mostly related to bears in bird feeders and trash cans stored outdoors. Unless there is some issue where people are threatened, the DOW will not remove or tranquilize the animal, which has been the standard position last year and this year so far. We do always respond to assess the situation when we get a call, however most times it's just a report of a bear in a yard or tree, no threat.

West Metro Fire Dept. – Steve Abrams reported that the special election outcome that the BOD that supported the District was elected. The mil levy was not approved. This station now has a 4 wheel drive ambulance and should be a more comfortable ride.
